Tickets for Children's Charities

The most beautiful music in the world is the sound of children laughing.

Since 1992, **Kennywood**, along with our sister parks **Idlewild & SoakZone** and **Sandcastle**, have donated nearly 300,000 days of summer fun through our **Tickets for Children's Charities** program, by providing tickets to organizations that **directly serve disadvantaged children and/or children with disabilities.**

This particular program is dedicated toward making an immediate, and direct, impact on youngsters with those particular special needs. It offers children who may not otherwise have the opportunity to experience one of our parks, a day filled with fun and laughter, and the promise of wonderful memories for years to come.

Written requests from tax-exempt 501C-3 charitable organizations whose requests fall within the program guidelines are accepted all year long by **Kennywood** and **Sandcastle**.

Two types of tickets are awarded:

TYPE A tickets are good any day of the current operating season by individual children.

TYPE B tickets are distributed in larger quantities and may be sold by an organization (that directly helps disadvantaged children or children with disabilities) as a fundraiser.

Type B Tickets are good weekdays during the summer season – restrictions may apply.

(Note: further date restrictions may apply to both Type A and Type B tickets. Review printed ticket when received)

Following the review of requests, in order of receipt, organizations receive a letter of acceptance or declination no later than March 1, 2017. Please understand that we receive hundreds of requests and a limited number of tickets are available for distribution.

How to request **Tickets for Children's Charities**:

Step 1: Review Mission Statement to determine if your organization qualifies:

The mission of Tickets for Children's Charities is to provide tickets to 501C-3 not-for-profit organizations to be used directly by disadvantage children and/or children with disabilities, and to provide tickets for fund-raising purposes for agencies that work directly with such children.

Step 2: Submit Letter of Request and Application Form

Include information about your organization, **the children you serve** and summary information regarding the number of tickets and who will utilize the tickets.

Requests must be received by January 15, 2017.

Frequently Asked Questions regarding the *Tickets for Children's Charities* program:

Q. Who qualifies to receive these tickets?

A. The mission of *Tickets for Children's Charities* is to provide tickets to 501C-3 not-for-profit organizations **to be used directly by disadvantaged children and/or children with disabilities**, and to provide tickets for fund-raising purposes for agencies that work directly with such children.

Q. Just what do *Tickets for Children's Charities* offer?

A. There are two categories of tickets: one benefiting individual children, and the other benefiting an organization that directly supports children.

Q. Are individuals raising funds privately eligible to receive tickets?

A. No. All tickets are disbursed via charities that directly benefit children, i.e., tickets are granted to 501C-3 organizations directly rather than through individual fundraising activities.

Q. May our group use tickets to raise money for our children with door prizes, raffles, etc.?

A. No. Type A tickets must go directly to children. Type B tickets may only be sold to raise money to directly benefit the children at the 501C-3 organization. Groups or individuals found to be reselling tickets for personal gain or any reason beyond those explicitly stated on this form (or in a group/individual application) risk voiding of Charitable Trust Tickets. Additionally, violators of this policy will be ineligible to apply and receive tickets from the Charitable Trust in future years.

Q. Do you accept proposals from 501C-3 non-profits outside the western Pennsylvania area?

A. Yes.

Q. Do past ticket recipients automatically receive tickets?

A. No. Each year is autonomous. You may also reapply if you did not receive tickets previously.

Q. When are applications for *Tickets for Children's Charities* accepted?

Applications may be submitted all year long but must be received by January 15, 2017 for the 2017 summer season. All the tickets for the 2016 season have been awarded. Applications are reviewed by date of receipt. Awards and distribution generally occur in March.

Q. Who decides which groups receive tickets?

A. A rotating committee at each park meets in February to award tickets
